

## IMPLICATIONS FOR POLICY

Results from WPs 1-5 and evidence-based policy recommendations for improving the sustainability impacts of trade policy in the EU, partner countries and the modernisation of the multilateral trade agreements will feed in this WP and will be presented in a systematic way and in a format adequate for policy-makers use. The WP will pay particular attention to the potential positive effects of compliance with and enforcement of Multilateral Environmental Agreements (MEAs) on forestry, biodiversity, climate. The WP will also provide a web-based training tool and explanatory materials to train negotiators, other stakeholders and students on the outcomes resulting from changing socio-economic and regulatory variables based on the network analysis in WP1 and modelling in WP3. Opinions of experts, academics, extension officers and farmers' representatives on the applicability of policy recommendations from WPs 1-5 to enhance the sustainability impact of the EU CAP will be analysed, providing valuable lessons for future development of CAP.
